The COMPASSS Working Papers aims at publishing state-of-the-art work on comparative configurational methods, with a focus on methodological and theoretical debate, and application of existing comparative techniques in new empirical domains.

Since January 2009 the COMPASSS Working Paper is managed by Maarten Vink (Maastricht University) in cooperation with an editorial committee composed of Gisèle de Meur, Jon Kvist, Charles Ragin, Carsten Schneider, Svend-Erik Skaaning, Barbara Vis and Claudius Wagemann. Each paper sent out for review is reviewed by two members of the editorial board. The review process is aimed at establishing a minimum quality before publication of working papers.

In 2009 we received seven submissions. Six of those papers were sent out for review. One paper was published after minor revisions and two were published after substantial revisions (two in 2009 and one in 2010). Three papers are currently being revised by the authors, in response to comments from the referees. We aim at publishing at least five papers in 2010.

We invite scholars to submit their work for publication as COMPASSS Working Papers. The WP series can be used by scholars both as a way to generate substantive feedback by the reviewers, as well as a way to disperse new ideas and applications via quick online publication.
