Compass makes available an email dialogue between Jerry Mendel, an electrical engineer at the University of Southern California, and Charles Ragin about Fuzzy Set Qualitative Comparative Analysis (fsQCA). The topics include: the meaning of "cases" and the problem of defining negative cases; the mechanics of counterfactual analysis and the distinction between easy and difficult counterfactuals; issues surrounding multiple calibrations of the same source data; coverage and consistency; the number of causal conditions; necessity and sufficiency; membership functions and regression analysis; and many more. The goal of the compilation is to make fsQCA more accessible, especially for people who want to understand the inner workings of fsQCA.
