#### --2. Software – updates and upgrades

- The 'software' page has been expanded, edited and updated in several sections; a disclaimer has been added, and 3 "add-on" QCA packages have been added. The page now covers 13 software options. This page will be further updated during the next few weeks.
- New software: QCApro 1.0-0 has been released on 27 January. It enables one to perform configurational comparative research with Qualitative Comparative Analysis (QCA), including crisp-set QCA, multi-value QCA, and fuzzy-set QCA. It also offers new features and advanced tools for methodological evaluations of QCA.
- New software: QCAGUI/QCA 2.1 has been released on 16 February. It enables one to perform Qualitative Comparative Analysis: crisp sets ('csQCA'), temporal ('tQCA'), multivalue ('mvQCA') and fuzzy sets ('fsQCA'), using a GUI - graphical user interface. It also offers new, flexible visualization tools (e.g. customizeable Venn diagrams).
